Cyndi Woods is a wife, mother, and writer. Her heart is in ministry and leading others to Christ. Cyndi is blind from a rare retinal disease and has been a member of the disabled community for 39 years. She is passionate about educating others on how to properly engage with the disabled community.

Sunday Disability is as widely diversified as people. There are many types of disability and within each type, there is a spectrum of severity. Thus, needs vary from person to person. Each disability carries its own unique set of assistive needs or even none at all. We must recognize that not all disability needs are the same and how to properly assist someone with a disability. This seminar will teach us how to be the hands and feet of Jesus within each disability need. It will also serve as a tool in learning some differentiation and understanding several different disability spectrums.
