Guidelines for Living With the Outdoors

Enjoy, but do not disturb or harm plants or animals. Stay on trails/roads and help all trash to end up in the trash containers.



Child Safety

Camp Au Sable has almost 800 acres. It is important for the safety of your children to closely supervise them at all times.

In-line Skating/Skateboarding/Non-Motorized Scooter Safety

Helmets, elbow, wrist, and knee pads are to be worn while enjoying skateboards, in-line skates, regular skates, or scooters. None of these activities are to take place on sidewalks, porches, or in buildings.



Vehicles

The speed limit throughout the camp is 15 mph, or less. For safety and environmental reasons, please restrict the use of your vehicle while at camp as much as possible. Please only park in the spaces provided for you, and not in the RESERVED area by the kitchen.



Lake Shellenbarger

Lake Shellenbarger is privately owned by Camp Au Sable and flows into the Au Sable River. The perimeters of the lake are muck, and there are shallow areas. Snapping turtles and leeches live in Lake Shellenbarger.

- No one should go to the waterfront areas alone.
- Swimming is allowed only in the swimming area when a life-guard is present.
- You may fish, but the camp has a catch and release policy.



Canoeing and Kayaking

Personal flotation devices are to be worn by all boaters of all ages. Cushions are for comfort only. There is also a sign-in sheet that will need to be filled out before and after your trip.

- No more than 4 persons per canoe (2 adults and 2 children)
- Tipping, standing up, rocking and ramming will not be permitted
- If your boat capsizes or swamps, stay with the boat until help arrives.



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
